Please describe your relationship, if any, with the Jewish community in the area you serve as an elected official: *Since elected, I have been building a relationship with the JCRC and am a founding member of the Jewish Democratic Club of Silicon Valley. I consider myself an ally and am eager to advocate for my neighbors of Jewish faith.*
2. Hate Crimes: Do you see Anti-Semitism as a Hate Crime? How do you propose working on Hate Crimes if you are elected? *Yes! When hate crimes have occurred in my community, I have leaned into these situations to work with the police, staff and impacted community members. I speak out against hate in community forums, rallies, convenings and from the dais on a regular basis. There is much work to do and I am committed to standing up against these injustices.*

As mentioned above, I am an outspoken advocate in support of my Jewish neighbors. I am working to become more familiar with issues of concern to the Jewish community by way of my affiliation with JCRC

I wish to continue to pursue my understanding of the Jewish community, culture and areas of concern.
